Prior Knowledge/Skills

Students should have a basic understanding of proper playing position, embouchure, and tone production.
Ability to play their instrument at a 7th-grade level, with general control of tone and pitch awareness.

Rehearsal Objectives

Develop consistent, controlled articulation using instrument-specific syllables ("Dah," "Doo," "Dee") to achieve clarity.
Reinforce correct tongue placement, emphasizing air interruption instead of stopping and re-engaging air as the main technique.
Introduce articulation syllables for woodwinds and brass (Flute - "DAH," Clarinet - "DEE," High Brass - "Dah," Low Brass - "Doh") to help students produce clear and precise articulation.
Practice articulation exercises on long tones to develop controlled note attacks and releases.
Apply articulation techniques in the rehearsal of "Air Force One" by Chris M. Bernotas to focus on articulation consistency within musical context.

Assessment of Rehearsal

- Observe and take note of students' accuracy with articulation syllables during warm-up exercises.
- Monitor improvement in articulation consistency across sections; take note of specific students who may be struggling.
- Evaluate articulation clarity, note releases, and consistency in "Air Force One" rehearsal.

Relevant Contextual Factors Modifications/Accommodations

Some students may need additional reinforcement on articulation syllables. Provide individualized guidance or visuals as needed.	For students struggling with tongue placement or throat shape, slow down the exercise and allow them to practice verbally away from the mouthpiece.
